2. LEGACY

Sri Jnanakshi Vidyaniketan was founded in the year 2000; with the divine blessings of Mother Rajarajeshwari; His Holiness Paramapujya Sri Sri Sri Tiruchi Mahaswamigal and Paramapujya Acharya Mahamandaleshwar Sri Sri Sri Jayendra Puri Mahaswamiji.

3. VISION

The vision of the institution is to provide Quality Education to the under privileged, socially, economically and academically challenged students. Pursuant with the “vision and mission” of our titular head and president of the Trust Sri Sri Sri Jayendrapuri Maha Swamiji; we have grown by leaps and bounds during the last Twenty-four years.

Our sole objective is to provide affordable; well rounded; value-based quality education to all the students on a Not-for-Profit basis; without any bias or discrimination.

4. FEE STRUCTURE

a) FEES

- I. Tuition fees : As per our norm 2024-25 tuition fees was hiked by 10% and block of 5 years 20 %.
- II. School development fees: The school development fee for the academic year 2024- 25 was hiked from Rs.60,000 to Rs.65000.
- III. School Bus Fees: School Bus fees has been hiked by 10%.
- IV. Increment of Salaries to staff: An increment of 10% of Gross salary plus experience-based incentive are provided to the eligible teachers every year and in the block of 5 years of their service 20% hike plus experience-based incentive will be given.

b) EXEMPTIONS :We have **09** philanthropists who have undertaken the cause of educating 80 underprivileged students across the classes from Play Home to class X.

SJV management has graciously exempted fees for 152 students, of which 71 staff children are studying in our school for whom 50% tuition fees is exempted. Apart from this, 100% fee exemption is given to 07 students, 75% exemption is given to 06 students, 50% exemption is given to 62 students and 25% exemption to 06 students.

c) ADMISSION UNDER RIGHT TO EDUCATION ACT (RTE)

As per RTE, the entry point in our school was in LKG and Class 1. We had RTE students till the Academic year 2018-19. As per the amendment in RTE act in 2019-20, RTE seats were not allotted to our school. Hence, we are not having any admission through RTE from 2019-20 onwards. At present we have 111 students studying under this act from class V to VIII.

The RTE students will be considered as regular students from class IX and have to pay regular school fees and school Development fees. But our school management has graciously exempted the School Development Fees.

6. INFRASTRUCTURE

Our 18-acre campus, blessed with one of the largest playgrounds in Rajarajeshwarinagar, provides an expansive and vibrant environment for students. The school buildings were graciously named by His Holiness Pujya Mahaswamiji as Jnana Baala, Jnana Nayana, and Jnana Nethra. Our CBSE affiliation has been successfully renewed and is valid up to 31.03.2029. To ensure safe and efficient transportation for students, the school operated 9 school buses and 6 BMTC buses, and additionally completed the construction of newly paved parking areas for school buses.

In the academic year 2024-25, 39 smart boards were installed in classes 5 to 10. In Jnana Nayana 3 K-YAN machines were purchased in addition to 3K-Yans already in operation. Internet connection has been provided to all classes and teachers are using PPTs and videos are developed to teach concepts in class rooms.

(i)JNANA BAALA: (PLAY HOME, LKG, UKG)

Our nursery building is housed in a vast area and is surrounded with lot of greenery. The ambience is conducive for child's learning; academic and physical growth. We have well equipped play ground with adequate playing tools, fully-equipped 3 AV rooms, 10 classrooms, and transportation facilities. The building was renovated in pyramid shaped roofs; tiled floorings; extended parking areas with pavered tiles. The playground is filled with sand.

(ii)JNANA NAYANA: (CLASS 1-6)

The school building houses and provides facilities like one well-equipped computer lab, one Audio Visual room, Music room with instruments, Yoga hall & well-ventilated classrooms. **662** books were added to the existing 4579 books in Junior library with.

(iii) JNANA NETHRA: (CLASS 7-10)

The massive school building houses and provides facilities like a well-equipped computer lab, one Audio Visual rooms, and individual labs for Physics, Chemistry, Biology has been put to use.

We have a well-equipped library with a large collection of books and the current leading newspapers, magazines in various languages. This year we have added **969** books to the existing 12569 books for the senior library

iv. Election committee & Student Council Committee:

For the formation of the Student Council Committee, elections were conducted fairly in accordance with the prescribed rules, and the elected representatives were formally sworn in during the Investiture Ceremony. The Student Council comprises of senior and junior School Captains and Vice-Captains, House Captains and Vice-Captains. The election process for the academic year was held on 05th June 2025. All school elections are managed by this committee while strictly adhering to the established norms and procedures.

Eligibility for Nomination:

Students of Classes 9 and 10 who have secured 75% or above and willing to contest were eligible to file nominations for the positions of School Captain and School Vice-Captain. Students of Classes 4 and 5 who have also secured **75% or above** and wish to contest applied for the positions of Junior School Captain and Junior School Vice-Captain. Additionally, students of Classes 9 and 10 who have obtained 50% or above were eligible to file nominations for the positions of House Captain and House Vice-Captain.

Scrutiny:

A test was administered to all students wishing to contest, and teachers who taught them in the previous year also provided their feedback to help assess each candidate's overall capabilities.

Voting Process:

The election took place digitally in the computer lab, where students from Classes IV to X cast their votes for the School Captains and Vice-Captains. The Student Council Committee met with the school management periodically. For the first time, Junior Captains and Vice-Captains were elected. v . Cultural Committee:

The cultural committee consists of ten teachers who take responsibility of cultural programmes of different classes. All the cultural programs went on smoothly due to the collective efforts of the members of the cultural committee and entire SJV family.

vi. Examination Committee:

The Examination Committee, comprising seven members, is responsible for ensuring the smooth conduct of all tests and examinations.

B. ACADEMIC PLANNING

i. Re-Opening of School:

The school reopened for Classes 1 to 10 on 27th May 2024, for LKG and UKG on 3rd June 2024, and for Nursery on 10th June 2024. The children were warmly welcomed by the teachers with traditional greetings.

ii. Calendar of events:

Calendar of Events for the academic year 2024-25 was given to children in their school diary.

iii. Bridge course:

Bridge course was conducted for the Class LKG to X. This helped to bridge the learning gap of their previous classes to present class. The important concepts were covered during the bridge course in order to have a continuity in studies.

iv. Role of Heads of Departments:

The heads of the respective departments actively support their teams in enhancing the quality of instruction and preparing effective lesson plans. All links, homework, worksheets, curriculum activities, and content were reviewed and approved by the subject heads before being shared with students. Lesson plans are continuously updated based on the guidelines provided by the HODs, incorporating new concepts and insights from various sources.

For this academic year, teacher working hours were revised to 8:00 am to 4:30 pm. To further improve the quality of education, the time slot from 3:00 pm to 4:30 pm was effectively utilized to align with NEP guidelines. This revised schedule was used productively for planning and implementing educational strategies.

v. Curricular framework :

a) Jnana Baala:

In the Jnana Baala block, Smart Kindergarten publications are being used to teach subjects such as EVS, English, and Number Work. Language instruction includes Kannada for all classes (PH, LKG & UKG), Hindi alphabets for UKG, and Spoken Sanskrit along with Bhagavad Gita chanting for LKG and UKG. A two-teacher concept is implemented to enhance learning and provide individual attention to students.

b) Jnana Nayana:

Classes 1 to 5 continue to use S Chand Publication Term Books for subjects including English, Mathematics, Computer Skills, General Knowledge, EVS (for Classes 1 & 2), Social Science (for Classes 3–5), and Science (for Classes 3–5). This approach has significantly reduced the weight of students' school bags. Languages such as Kannada, Hindi, and Sanskrit are also taught. Additionally, the curriculum includes Physical Education (PE), Abacus, Yoga, Life Skills, and Bhagavad Gita chanting.

c) Jnana Nethra:

For classes 6 to 10, the curriculum is structured using a variety of resources to support comprehensive learning. English is taught using Buzzword for classes 6 to 8 and NCERT for classes 9 and 10. Social Science for all classes from 6 to 10 follows the NCERT textbooks. Science is taught using Rachana Sagar for classes

6 to 8 and NCERT for classes 9 and 10, while Mathematics for classes 6 to 10 is based on NCERT. Computer Science is covered using Kips IT for classes 6 to 8 and NCERT for classes 9 and 10. Languages are taught according to the State Board curriculum. The academic program also integrates Physical Education (PE), Yoga, Life Skills, Address Health, and Bhagavad Gita chanting, ensuring holistic development of the students.

vi. Workshops: Based on NEP, workshops were organized to introduce pedagogy techniques and classroom management, which have enabled the teachers to introduce fun-based learning in their classes and plan their lessons effectively.

vii. FOSTER TEACHER CALL TO CLASS X STUDENTS.

Subject teachers handling class X were given 8-9 students each to call them once in a fortnight to motivate, encourage, guide and to monitor students about their study habits. Students were advised to follow a study timetable & to wake up at 4.00am. There were 187 students who were in the care of 21 Foster teachers. Principal called randomly every week & Secretary Sir called from January onwards.

viii. SKILL SUBJECTS FOR CLASS VI-IX:

In the CBSE curriculum for classes 6 to 8, Digital Citizenship is a compulsory skill subject, taught by Computer Department teachers. This course covers essential topics like online safety, digital ethics, privacy, and

responsible use of technology. At the end of the course, students took an exam and students receive certificates issued by CBSE.

For classes 9 and 10, the skill subject offered is Information Technology. This subject focuses on the practical use of computers and digital tools, including areas like programming, software applications, and data management. Importantly, the marks from this skill subject can replace the marks of any failed subject in class 10, providing an opportunity for students to improve their overall results.

ix. VALUE EDUCATION:

To enhance value education, dedicated periods have been allocated for Value Education and Life Skills classes, catering to students from classes 1 to 9. The topics for these sessions are taken from prescribed textbooks and relevant CBSE manuals.

x. DIARY WRITING PERIOD.

For classes 1 and 2, the Diary Writing period is scheduled for 40 minutes. For classes 3 to 5, the Diary Writing period is 20 minutes. For classes 6 to 10, the diary period has been converted into a 20-minute Newspaper Reading period, helps students to inculcate reading practice.

xi. CLASS LIBRARY.

Importance on reading was emphasized through class libraries. Most of the students of classes I-X have donated books to their classrooms and they read their book of interest every day during the break time.

xii. SAFAL EXAMINATION.

CBSE had intro SAFAL exam for grade 5 and grade 8 students to test competency level of the students.

Examination was conducted on 22.07.24 for class 5 and 8, examination will be conducted on 06.08.2024.

xiii. REMEDIAL CLASSES:

Remedial classes were conducted for selected students of classes III to X for five days a week from the month of November between 3:00pm -4:30pm; with the consent of the parents; who needed hand holding in all subjects; so that individual attention can be given during these classes. The subject teachers helped them in academics under the supervision of the HODs.

xiv. REVISION CLASSES: Revision plan was provided to students of class X and revisions were conducted till the last date of the exam.

xv. RESOURCE ROOM:

In line with our objective that every child deserves to achieve the minimum learning level, the school had introduced Resource Room classes to support children with learning disabilities. To strengthen this initiative, the school has appointed special educators and a psychological counsellor.

xvi. CHANGE OF TEXTBOOKS

- NCERT has redesigned and updated the contents of the Science and Social Science textbooks.
- The *English Skill Enhancer* books for Classes 6 to 8 have been withdrawn.
- *Cyber Quest* has been introduced as the Computer textbook for Classes 7 and 8.
- For Class 10, the *Information Technology* textbook has been updated and the contents have been reframed.

xvii. ROBOTICS: Robotics classes were conducted weekly once from classes VI TO VIII. Annual Quiz is conducted for different levels and a certificate was issued to all students along with a robotic kit for class 8.

xviii. ABACUS: Abacus classes were conducted weekly once for classes I TO V to improve their mental and basic maths skills. Interclass quiz was conducted at the end of the year and the top three students of each class were awarded prizes.

xix. NIE & GAP : The Students edition newspaper and GAP books for classes 1-5 improves reading habits in children and enrich their knowledge in vocabulary, grammar and current affairs. Quizzes were conducted during the assembly.

xx. NIOS- “Education for All, Anytime, Anywhere.”

The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) is an autonomous institution under the Ministry of Education, Government of India, offering flexible and inclusive schooling options. It provides opportunities for learners who cannot pursue regular schooling, allowing them to study at their own pace through open and distance learning. NIOS offers academic, vocational, and life-enrichment courses, ensuring accessible education for all age groups, especially for those needing an alternative pathway to complete their schooling.

This enables students to pursue various courses and programs offered by NIOS, including secondary and senior secondary levels, vocational education, and life enrichment programs.

Our school applied for NIOS permission in May 2024 and the permission was granted on 7th February 2025.

ACTIVITIES

a. Assembly Activities: The school conducted a variety of meaningful assembly activities across Jnana Baala, Jnana Nayana, and Jnana Nethra throughout the year. In Jnana Baala, teachers and students presented concept-based role plays, stories, and rhymes to instill moral values such as good touch and bad touch, cleanliness, respect for elders, and seeking parents' blessings. Children also participated in yoga sessions along with fine motor, gross motor and sensory development activities. Birthdays were celebrated in the assembly by crowning the birthday child as prince or princess and singing birthday songs in multiple languages, while encouraging healthy treats like groundnut chikkies. Major festivals including Raksha Bandhan, Onam, Janmashtami, Varamahalakshmi, Gowri Ganesha, Dasara, Deepavali, and Sankranti were observed with enthusiasm, and their cultural significance was explained. Year-round class activities such as Vachana Gayana, Panchangam and Ramayana Quiz enriched the learning experience. In Jnana Nayana, assemblies for Classes 1–5 were held every Tuesday and Thursday, following a structured format of prayer, pledge, birthday wishes, class activities, announcements, and the national anthem. D. ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION:

i) Pre-Primary classes:

After each concept, informal assessments are conducted through activity based teaching for the children in their regular classes. Term - end assessment time table and portion were sent in the student's school diary. Oral and writing examination for English, Number work, EVS and Kannada were conducted as scheduled.

ii) Primary and Middle classes:

2 tests and 2 examinations were conducted as per the schedule during the academic year.

iii) Highschool:

a) For class IX- Monthly tests from 3:15pm -4:15pm, Periodic assessments, Mid term examination, School Preboard examination, Annual examination and re-examination were conducted.

b) For class X - Fortnightly tests from 3:15pm -4:15pm, Periodic assessments, Mid term examination, School Preboard examination, Sahodaya pre-board examinations were conducted. For the fortnightly tests, three sets of question papers with varying difficulty levels were prepared and assigned to students based on their learning ability and pace, as assessed by the subject teacher. Results were shared within a week, and students received constructive suggestions and feedback to help them improve across subjects. Students consistently prepared for all subjects during the fortnightly, mid-term, pre-board, and board examinations, and their outstanding board results reflect the effectiveness of these efforts.
